Overview of Responsibility:

Summer Intensive Chaperones are responsible to oversee the safety, wellbeing and conduct of dancers staying in Ballet 5:8 Housing during the Summer Intensive, Collegiate Intensive, and Choreographer's Intensive. Chaperones are also responsible to ensure that the dancers' practical needs are met, such as food on weekends and laundry. Chaperones are responsible to plan and implement any weekend activities for the dancers, taking the dancers to church, assisting in the event of any medical needs that may arise during the intensive.

General Responsibilities:

- Ensure the general safety and wellbeing of dancers at all times of Chaperone responsibility. This includes helping the dancers follow housing guidelines, COVID-19 safety protocols, and any additional safety measures.
- Assisting and monitoring medical needs of the Summer Intensive dancers including
 monitoring they are taking their medication, taking them to doctor visits if
 applicable, and working with Ballet 5:8 staff and the dancer if any injuries occur. RAs
 will also stay with sick students in housing for the day in the event that a dancer is
 sick.
- Play an active role in monitoring and enforcing housing rules with minors and attendees above the age of 18.
- Serve as a mediator for student conflict. Bring severe or unresolved issues to the attention of the Sr. Studio Manager.
- Be involved in mentoring housing students via Bible Study and in student housing.
- Drive students to and from the studios and other activities using Ballet 5:8's rental van or your personal vehicle.
- Transport students in Ballet 5:8 rented vehicles to evening and weekend activities such as the laundromat, grocery store, and other outings.
- Bring students to Sunday church service.
- Plan weekly outings for laundry and grocery shopping.
- Plan weekend activities and outings in tandem with Ballet 5:8 staff.
- Ensure attendees above the age of 18 are following the car/transportation policy.
